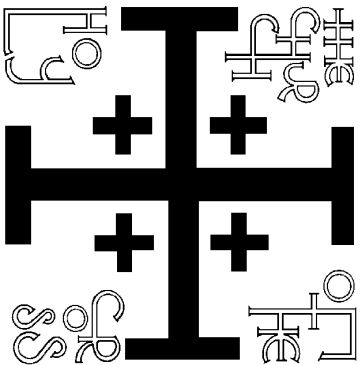
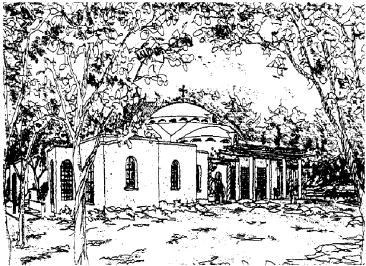

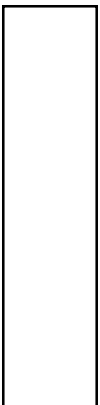

An orthodoX response

(second in a series of excerpts from *An Eastern Orthodox Response to Evangelical Claims* by Father Paul O'Callaghan, Antiochian Archdiocese)

Worshiping Mary as the "Mother of God"? (3) Some Orthodox traditions are paganistic, like worshiping the Virgin Mary as the "Mother of God."

First of all, Orthodox Christians do not worship Mary. Worship is reserved for God alone. However, Mary is greatly esteemed and honored as the one chosen by God to bring forth His Only Begotten Son into the world.

Because of this, she is the most exalted of all creatures. She herself prophesied, "All generations shall call me blessed" (Luke 1 :48).

Jesus Christ is an eternal, divine Person who took on a complete human nature through the Virgin Mary (cf. John 1: 1,14). He is expressly called "God" in the Scriptures (cf. John 20:28). As Mary gave birth to and nurtured a divine Person, she is rightly called the "Mother of God." This, of course, does not imply that she is the mother of God the Father. Many of those who question the title "Mother of God" are those who also doubt the full divinity of Jesus Christ. There is nothing paganistic in the Church's veneration of the Mother of Our Savior.

Prayer to Mary and the Saints (4) The Orthodox pray to Mary and the other saints. Isn't this worship?

Orthodox Christians ask Mary and other saints to intercede for us before God in prayer. The Orthodox believe that the reality of the Church

encompasses both the living and those who have died and are now "with Christ" (Phil. 1 :23). Those who have died in Christ do not care for us any less, nor do they cease to pray for us because they have passed into eternal life. We approach the saints with veneration as we ask their prayers. In no way can this be compared to the worship we offer the Triune God.

Last month we started to single out members of ORA to let everyone get to know them better by giving a short biographical sketch.

Our President, **Arick Mathios**, was our first biography. This month I am going to tell you the life highlights of our very capable past vice-president **Angie Stambollis** and her delightful husband **Peter**.

Angie and Peter were married 52 ½ years ago in the Vallejo church. They had two children, Vickie and Lee. Unfortunately their beloved daughter, Vicki passed away at the age of 19 with a heart condition.

Angie was born in Vallejo and was always active. During her younger years, she worked in Vallejo for Meyers Jewelry Store and also did modeling for the City of Paris, Levy's Department Store and Rose Boutique. At age 16, she and a group of Greek girlfriends formed a sorority and called themselves the "Alpha Gamma Sigma" Sorority, which for them, stood for the "American Greek Society". Angie was elected president four times and during her presidency organized a Greek dance group. The sorority also gave spaghetti dinners, picnics, barn dances, etc.

In 1948, when the Greeks in Vallejo were planning to build a church, Angie and her sorority sisters went Christmas Kalanda caroling in the Greek homes. Everyone welcomed them and were so very happy to hear the "Kalanda" sung in Greek in their homes. Many had not heard the kalanda sung since they had left their homeland to come to America. The first year, Angie and her friends raised \$500 for the church, in today's world that does not sound like a lot of money, but in 1948 that was considered quite a substantial amount. The \$500 was used to buy the organ for the new church.

In 1949, Angie and Peter were married and they were privileged to be the second couple to be married in the new church.

The Alpha Gamma Sigma Society has lost two of the original nine members. There remaining members continue to get together every two months and also continue to contribute to the Vallejo church. In 1999, the Vallejo church celebrated its 50th Anniversary. Angie was selected to present the church with a monetary gift from the Alpha Gamma Sigma Sorority. Our **Father Peter** and **Presbytera Nikki** were also in attendance at the celebration.

Peter, Angie's husband, is a new member of O.R.A. He is a very low-key, unpretentious person who doesn't like talking about himself. Because of these qualities he has won the love and respect of his friends and co-workers and the employers he has worked for. Peter was born in Karpathos, Greece and came to the U.S. in 1946. From 1946 until 1948, he lived and worked in New York. In 1948, he came to California for 3 years and worked as a waiter at the popular and old landmark restaurant "Roberts at the Beach" in San Francisco. In 1951, he went to work for the exclusive restaurant "Doro's" on Montgomery Street in the financial district in San Francisco. He was employed there for 35 years. It is at Doro's that Peter's life became so interesting and fascinating. When he would come home from work, Angie would always ask him who he had waited on that day. The clientele at Doro's consisted of countless famous people in every field you can imagine. Names like Zellerbach, Bechtel, Butterfield, Schultz and Feinstein.

Many winemakers came to Doro's. Robert Mondavi was a customer. He would invite all of Doro's employees to his winery in Napa

every year for a party and give them seminars so the waiters would be knowledgeable on his wines.

Melvin Belli, the late, famous lawyer, was a steady and daily customer at Doro's. Peter waited on him everyday.

Belli's office was next door to Doro's and when he arrived for lunch, Peter had to have (of all things) a head of garlic waiting for him. Peter also had access to Belli's services when he needed them and Belli never charged him or any of Peter's friends. The Stambollis' were invited every Christmas to Belli's exclusive home in San Francisco for a party.

Peter waited on many people in the sports world. The Giants team dined at Doro's and Peter obtained the signature of all the players including the famous Willie Mays on a baseball for his son Lee. Needless to say, Lee was the happiest boy on the block.

Movie stars loved coming to Doro's. I'm sure they loved having Peter wait on them. Just a few names of the famous were Tyrone Power, Zsa Zsa Gabor, Lana Turner, Loretta Young, Loretta's brother-in-law Ricardo Montalban, Carol Channing (who incidentally brought her own food), Shirley Temple (Peter's favorite) -- Shirley now lives in Woodside, Joan Crawford (who at that time was married to the president of Pepsi Cola and liked Peter so much she gave him her cigarette lighter which played "Pepsi Cola Hits the Spot") -- Joan also brought her own Vodka, Tennessee Ernie Ford (who at first refused to wear a tie for entrance) and Fess Parker who was playing Daniel Boone at the time. Fess invited Peter and his family to be his personal guest at Warner Brothers studio in Hollywood for one day. He even gave them their own personal guide. Vickie and Lee were so thrilled and happy especially when they saw Andy Griffith who was filming the show "Mayberry RFD" at that time. The movie producers, the Skouras Brothers, dined at Doro's also.

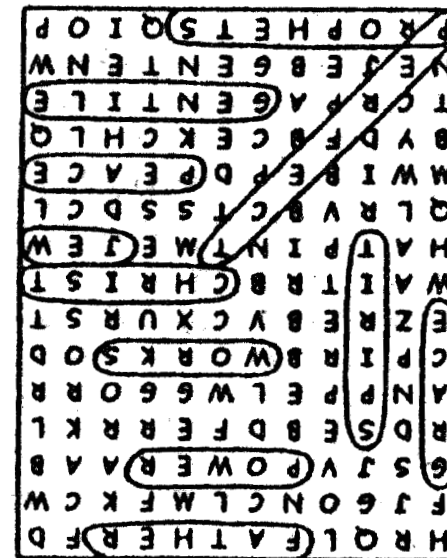
Employees of the Sherwood Insurance Company, who had an affiliation with Lloyds of London, would eat at Doro's every day and Peter took care of the president Mr. Sherwood and his associates. When the Sherwood Company had their 25th anniversary at the "365 Club" (formerly known as "Bimbo's"), Mr. Sherwood, the president, gave a

speech and as he was thanking everyone for their services he said, "There is someone here that I want to honor. If I had a bad day he made me feel good, and if I had a good day, he made me feel better". He then said, "Peter Stambollis, please stand up". There were 700 people present. Peter was very honored and Angie was very proud of her husband.

After Doro's closed, Peter worked at the Villa Taverna, a very private exclusive place. A person had to be a member to dine there. All of San Francisco society would dine there for lunch and dinner.

I hope you have enjoyed hearing about our members Angie and Peter Stambollis. Angie was so dedicated as past Vice President and worked so very hard. She was also our Raffle Chairman. She spent a great deal of time getting prizes donated and making money for O.R.A. with the raffles.

From deACon AtHAnAslos

I would like to wish all of you a Happy New Year. During the month of January when we see someone we greet them with the wish for a Happy New Year. Also, we extend our wish for them to have a peaceful and fruitful year. We use the term fruitful because the church is the true vineyard and as the faithful we are its branches. Also as good Christians we have to do good works which will produce the good fruits. Please take a moment to think about how many gifts and talents that each one of us has? Our gifts and talents must be multiplied for our spiritual growth but especially so that through us our gifts and talents can be used so that other people can see and give glorify to our Lord (Προς Δόξαν Θεου.) Keeping that in mind how we can multiply our gifts and talents let's take for instance the feast of the Circumcision of our Lord Jesus Christ which we celebrate on the first of the year with the feast of Saint Basil the Great. Why was Christ circumcised? Jesus Christ was circumcised on the eighth day because He came to live according to the Law but especially because He came to complete the Law. Circumcision was the covenant or agreement of the Jewish people that they would dedicate their life to God. Our Lord Jesus Christ completes the Law with His obedience to His Father with the circumcision. Of course today we need not be circumcised to obey the law because our Lord Jesus Christ completed the Law for us but we follow the same Tradition when on the eighth day we take our newborn babies to the church to give them their names. Many times our Lord Jesus Christ said let it be done to Him according to His Father's will. Our Lord Jesus Christ came to show us how to obey His Father by showing us

with His Holy example. From the Gospel readings we know very few things about Jesus' childhood. The Gospel only mentions His infant times, the trip to Egypt, His returned to Jerusalem and at the age of twelve when He went to the temple. At the temple we know that He explained the prophecies from the Scriptures and that the elders were astonished with His knowledge at such a young age. The Gospel does not give any account from the time that He was 12 years old until He started His ministry at the age of 30. Most of the information that we know comes from the Holy Tradition of our Church, which says that He was assisting Joseph and working as a carpenter. It is very important to remember that the Gospels were written during the period of 50-70 AD. People kept the tradition from generation to generation by telling stories. This is the difference between us; the Orthodox Church, and other churches such as the Roman Catholic and Protestant churches. We stay close to our Holy Tradition. The Holy Tradition is like a tree that has good roots. A tree without roots on the other hand is like a house without a good support that is going to fall. Our good root gives us our identity and explains the reason that we do things differently from the others. Again through our Holy Tradition we know about the great obedience that our Lord Jesus Christ had to His earthly parents and protectors the Theotokos and Joseph. The reason that I mention the Holy tradition is because I want to make the connection of how we relate with the Gospel but especially with the teachings of our Lord.

I believe very strongly that we have to follow the examples of our Lord Jesus Christ who obeyed His parents. In fact it is the fifth commandment to obey our parents. A lot of times we are going to disagree with our parents but is better to do something with obedience and love. It is a virtue to be able to love our parents and follow their will. Our Lord Jesus Christ when He was twelve years of age spoke with the high priests in the temple and He was able to explain all the prophesies but when Joseph and Theotokos found Him at the temple He obeyed them and followed them home.

On the first day of January we also celebrate the feast of Saint Basil the Great. Saint Basil was one of the three hierarchs. Saint Basil gave an emphasis to education. I wanted to remind you of this because while you are students your job right now is your school. As Christians

we have the responsibility to do everything with our best ability and you also have the responsibility to succeed in your education. Now that you have this opportunity you must take advantage of it so that you can make your life easier in your future. In fact our Lord wants us to be well educated so that we can use our knowledge and understanding to learn about Him. He wants us to use our education to experience that He is the Truth. Saint Basil the Great said that we have to be like the bees that are sitting on the flowers being able to take the best of the fruits from each. We have to be very selective where we sit but especially how we spent our time and this comes with experience. This is what the true education gives you the opportunity of the knowledge of what is right and what is wrong so that we can know that our Lord is the True Light.

I pray very humbly that all of us receive His Grace and Love as so to enlighten our life so we can have a blessed and fruitful year becoming worthy of His heavenly Kingdom.



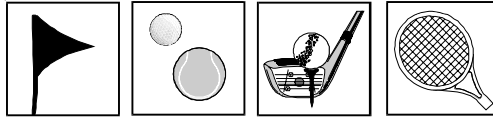
