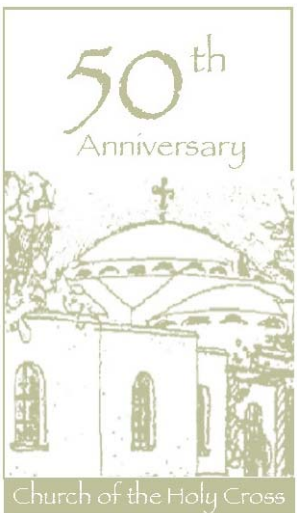

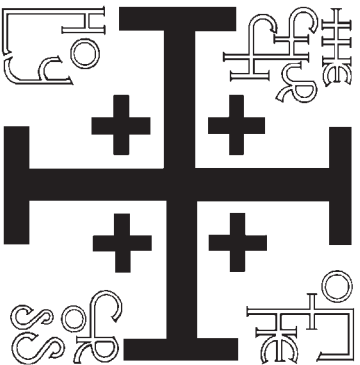
Our Struggle to Personhood-Sainthood

The following is taken from Archimandrite Vasileios' book, "The Saint: Archetype of Orthodoxy." The challenge today is to live our lives giving glorification to our Creator, for this is our real purpose. How we come to terms with this in our daily lives will be reflected in our decision and action. It may appear to be a taunting quest but, as your priest I can tell you that "all is possible with God, hence if we chose to connect to God, that which Saint James states in his letter will be realized. "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you." It is with this in mind that I encourage each of us to make all of our time God's time.

What is deification? Deification is the end and purpose of man's existence. Man has no other reason for existing. Today there is much discussion regarding various philosophies and what they want man to become: economic man, modern man, post-modern man, pre-modern man... But what is the point of being modern or post-modern when death is waiting to swallow us up? The is for death to be transcended—and this is what deification means. This is the reason why God created man in His image and likeness. This is the reason why, after the Fall, God cared for man and waited for his return. And we must be grateful to the Mother of God who raised human

nature to the point where it could not only receive God and bear Him within itself, but could actually bring for God and give birth to Him. The Son of God came, and became the Son of Man. He counts us worthy to have back all those potentialities we had lost, provided we desire to approach God.

Now we live, we go about our daily affairs, we repent. As Scripture says, no one is without sin, even if he lives only one day. Take the case of the Publican: the Publican had his own sins, a small child has its own sensitivity. If only we had the sensitivity of a small child or the contrition of the Publican.

So we go on with our spiritual life: we struggle, we repent, we seek God's mercy, we exercise patience. And as we exercise patience in our discipline of asceticism, humility and love, at some moment something happens. Again as Saint Isaac says, "suddenly", "without your knowledge", "without external cause", "unexpectedly", something happens within you.

You radiate a joy, an exultation, a gladness. Puzzled, you say: This is not something of my own. And yet it has been given to you. Why? Because God is supreme in goodness. But you say: But I didn't deserve it! I should have been punished! And then you understand why Saint Isaac says that God is not just, He is unjust. Why? Well, if He were just, He would have burnt us all to ashes. And you remember the Abba saying that God is fearful not because of His power but because of His love.

MEMORY LANE 8 -- 50 YEARS AGO

A strong foundation had been laid by the parishioners of the Church of the Holy Cross throughout the 1960’s under the leadership of Father Steven Katsaris. In the early 1970’s, we saw two changes in pastors; Father Philip Koutoufas from October of 1971 to December of 1972, and Father Alex Fasoulas from December 1972 to June 1974.

The arrival of Father George Stevenson (6/74 to 10/79) in 1974 revitalized the parish and expanded its membership to 400 families. In the light of this new growth, the General Assembly, in the fall of 1975, mandated the Parish Council to present preliminary plans to the membership for a much needed Community Center and classroom complex. The parish once

again entered a Building Fund Campaign and, in 1978, the present Community Center and classrooms complex were completed.

The Very Reverend Leonidas Contos assumed duties of Pastor from October 1979 to August 1988. In September of 1983, the long-awaited consecration was celebrated with His Eminence Archbishop Iakovos and His Grace Anthony. A weekend was planned in recognition of the contributions of many, especially the founders of the community. Three members were recognized for their long service to the church and the office of Archon of the Patriarchate of Constantinople was conferred upon them. Father Contos was also honored and elevated to the office of Archimandrite by His Eminence.

For the next 5 years, the parish continued to grow and strengthen its spiritual base. Father Leon’s wisdom and experience had a stabilizing influence on the community. Father Leon’s artistic and administrative talents left an indelible imprint on this community with the creation of our distinctive church logo and the introduction of the church newsletter, *Cross Currents*. With the arrival of Father Constantine Pappademos in June of 1986, the youth ministries began to witness a resurgence.

For the first time since the building of the Church, landscaping plans were initiated and the facility began to take on a park-like atmosphere, serene and conducive to mediation and prayer. During Father Leon’s pastorate, the parish continued to grow to 550 families.

SUNRISE, SON RISE

School’s out for the Summer! Funny, that used to have a more pleasant ring to it, but you can only do so many sports camps and swimming lessons with the kids. Before you doom your child’s mind to yet another hour in front of the television or video game, let me offer a wholesome alternative, a summer reading list with emphasis on our faith and values.

Let’s start with fundamentals, like *The Bible* itself. *The Orthodox Study Bible* is a readable translation of the New Testament and the Psalms. It is very well annotated and devotes additional pages to Feastdays, Sacraments and other Orthodox concepts. After reading this text, you will have experienced *The Bible* from an Orthodox perspective. Younger children (early readers through middle school) will enjoy *The Children’s Illustrated Bible* (Hastings & Thomas) with bite-sized summaries of key parts of both the Old and New Testaments, beautifully illustrated and annotated. Toddlers will love *The Beginner’s Bible* (Zondervan). The whole family will enjoy Tomie de Paola’s *Book of Bible Stories*, *Parables of Jesus* and *Miracles of Jesus*.

Add in videos and books from the *VeggieTales* series as well.

We then turn to books focusing on the Orthodox faith. *God's Bubbly, Gurgly, Overwhelming, Overflowing Love* (Pappas/Boutzarelos) is a great bridge between *The Bible* and Orthodox teachings, because it summarizes God's plan for man's



salvation in terms that a pre-schooler can understand. Fr. Coniaris' *Let's Take a Walk Through Our Orthodox Church* should be read and discussed at home and then brought to Church, so that the child can connect the concepts in the book to Church surroundings. *An Orthodox Treasury of Stories for Young and Old* (Hronas) would be a nice text for a family reading time. Stories include the life of St. Catherine, the Easter flame at the Holy Sepulchre and many parables that bring home important values. *Twelve Great Feasts for Children* is a collection of 12 booklets, each devoted to a Feastday. Nicely illustrated, it begins with the Dismissal Hymn of the Feastday and includes an inspirational verse that captures the spirit of the day. A great way to keep the Orthodox calendar in your home! Next stop: August 6 and Transfiguration. Put on the CD, *O Gladsome Light*, by EIKONA and bring many of the Church hymns into your home.

Children need heroes to emulate, and who better than the saints. *The Story of Mary, the Mother of God* (Papademetriou) is a lovely volume for toddlers and early readers. *North Star: St Herman of Alaska* (Papademetriou), *The Boy, The Kitchen and His Cave: St. Euphrosynos* (Contopoulos) and Tomie de Paola's stories of St. Patrick, St. Francis and St. Christopher are further examples that are sure to inspire your youngster. There are several books about the life of St. Nicholas, but I'll save those for Christmastime.

As parents, we all struggle to inculcate our children with our values. *God's Wisdom for Little Boys* and *God's Wisdom for Little Girls* (George) present our values in a beautifully illustrated format complete with scriptural references. William Bennett has two anthologies, *The Children's Book of Virtues* and *The Children's Book of Home and Family*. He has gathered stories from many traditions about honesty (George Washington and the cherry tree), patience and helpfulness. Lynne Cheney offers *America: A Patriotic Primer* spotlighting elements of the American nation that all children need

to know. And de Paola's *Clown of God* is a must-read, teaching us about sharing, persistence and the rise and fall of our lives.

Many of these books are available at our Church bookstore. If not, you can find them at local bookstores and on the Internet. Happy reading! I'm sure you'll even learn a few new things along the way.

FATHER LEON FELLOWSHIP FOR GRAD STUDENTS



The Church of the Holy Cross was blessed to have Father Leon Contos with us from 1979 to 1988. He remains an educational icon of our Church and embodied what living a true Christian life means. All who met him remember his grace, intellect, wit and warmth. Father Leon was Dean of Saint Sophia Cathedral from 1951 to 1965 and President of Hellenic College/Holy Cross Theological School from 1966 to 1972. With a Ph.D. from Oxford University and several honorary doctorates, he came to Belmont to continue his pastoral work. He brought to our parish a strong sense of stability and Christian purpose. His sermons are regarded as some of the most articulate and insightful. He was truly a scholar and a gentleman, a proud father, grandfather and loving husband. His leadership, quiet yet strong, allowed for lay leaders in our parish to grow. He pointed the way with a firm yet gentle hand. He was the consummate teacher. Understanding the importance of education within our Church, Father Leon became the first President of the Patriarch Athenagoras Institute at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, California and was honored as the Alex G. Spanos Professor of Orthodox Studies there.

The Philoptochos, too, sees the support of educational endeavors as one of its main focuses. For the Church to survive, the faithful must be knowledgeable in their religion. In that vein, the Philoptochos established the Very Reverend Dr. Leonidas C. Contos Fellowship. This monetary award is presented to a graduate student(s) who has attained educational excellence, is pursuing graduate studies and has displayed Christian values working within a church community. The award is possible through an endowment in Father Leon's memory.

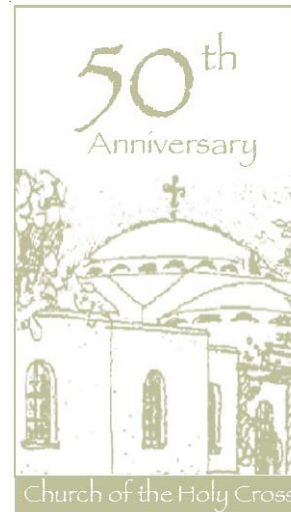
